# **Drama**

# **Objective**

Students will describe main characters in a drama text and describe its plot elements through dialogue.

## **Materials**

- Two drama texts—a text for teacher modeling (one for teacher) and a text for student practice (one per student or group)
- Drama handout

### **Overview**

Provide explicit instruction with modeling before having students practice independently or in groups.

# **Activity**

- 1. Distribute the text and the Drama handout.
- 2. Discuss the plot elements on the handout and provide the following examples:
  - Exposition: Mike and Jill are camping in the forest and decide to take a walk.
  - Rising action: Mike and Jill find a bear cub and try to pet it.
  - Climax: Mommy Bear jumps out at Mike and Jill and chases them through the forest.
  - Falling action: Mike and Jill cross a river and Mommy Bear stays on the side with her cub.
  - Resolution: Mike and Jill make it back to their campsite safely.
- **3.** Review dialogue (students will use dialogue to fill out the plot elements on the last page of the handout). Remind students to watch for quotation marks.
- **4.** Model the process with the example text and complete the handout.
- **5.** Have students practice the process. Provide scaffolding as necessary.

### **Drama**

#### **Plot Elements**

- **Exposition:** Information about the setting and characters
- **Rising action**: Part of the story that develops the problem or conflict
- Climax: Part of the story where the problem or conflict reaches its peak
- Falling action: Part of the story after the problem or conflict occurs
- **Resolution:** The conclusion of the story that reveals the outcome or solution to the problem or conflict
