Abbreviations and Contractions

Objective

Students will use abbreviations and contractions.

Materials

- Handout 1: Abbreviations
- Handout 2: Contractions
- Scissors and glue
- Students' journals
- Optional video for teacher: *Contractions* (http://texasgateway.org/resource/contractions)

Overview

Explicitly model how to complete the handouts. Monitor students and provide support as needed.

Activity

- **1.** Review the meaning of abbreviations and contractions:
 - An abbreviation is a shortened way to write a word. Abbreviations must include a period after the last letter. Example: *Mr. Mister*.
 - A contraction is a shortened form of a set of words. The apostrophe in contractions stands for missing letters. Example: *don't do not*.
- **2.** Have students complete the handouts. **Optional:** Have students use the words in a sentence.
- **3.** Have students cut out and glue their completed tables in their journal as a reference to use during writing tasks.
